PROJECT

As this course focuses on the history of graphic design, I want you to explore the history of design in more depth. This class is a survey on the history of design so we only scratch the surface. For this project, you will be choosing a film about art and/or design to learn more about a particular aspect of design. I have provided a list of films to choose from below. You must choose one from this list. Most of the films are available for renting online and some may be available either through the Art Office Library, from the college Library, or through your local library. There may be other ways for you to obtain the movie.

After watching the video, you will create a three minute video as a review of the film. Unlike a movie critic, you will not be focused on the quality of the movie, but instead on the content of the movie. How can you sum up the important information from the film? What were the most interesting things from the movie? What would you want want to tell someone about the movie? These types of things should be considered before beginning to make your movie. I recommend typing up your thoughts before creating your movie. Approximately a page to a page and half should be sufficient to meet the time requirements.

Also, make sure if using video or images that you cite them appropriately at the end of your video.
